2. Read Matthew 6:33. What would you say are the things most valued in the Kingdom of God?
3. Pastor Will taught that the best way to evaluate your priorities is to look at how you spend your time and how you spend your money. Based on your calendar, what are the things you spend the most time on?
4. Based on your bank statement, what are the things you spend the most discretionary money on?
5. Having evaluated your priorities in relation to how you spend your time and money, does what you say is most important to you line up with how you actually live?
6. What priorities need to change in your life?
7. Who do you have in your life that has permission to tell you when you are a walking contradiction...when your life and what you say you value aren’t in alignment?

MOVING FORWARD

When your priorities change, you change. The first step in changing your priorities is coming close to God. The more you know God, the more you will be able to trust God. The more you trust God, the more you will be able to genuinely delight in God (Psalm 37:4).
